

Overview of procedures for applying for a short-term stay visa with multiple validity

(Philippines, Vietnam, and Indonesia nationals residing in BC or Yukon in Canada)

《Those who have sufficient economic strength》

- Those who have the nationality of India residing in BC or Yukon in Canada and have sufficient economic strength, they may apply for a short-term stay visa with multiple validity.
- With a short-term visa, it is not allowed to engage in activities such as operating a business with income or reward in Japan.
- Depending on the annual income or assets of the visa applicants, they may be able to obtain a multiple entry visa of valid for up to 5 years within 90 days.
- It is not always possible to issue a short-term stay visa with multiple validity. As a result of the examination, the visa may not be issued or a visa with single or double validity may be issued.

- ☐ 1. Valid passport (If applicable, old passports with Japanese immigration stamps)
- ☐ 2. Valid Long Stay Permit in Canada (e.g., PR card, Work Permit or Study Permit)
- ☐ 3. 1 photo (45×35mm, taken within 6 months)
- ☐ 4. Visa application [Form](#)
- ☐ 5. Flight itinerary or flight reservation include all destinations from your starting departure (nearest airport to you in BC or Yukon) to the next destination after Japan, all the flight number, all the date of departure/arrival and each airport name.
 - * The confirmed reservation record is acceptable.
- ☐ 6. Travel itinerary [Form](#)
 - * Must be indicated daily Activity Plan, Accommodation, Accommodation's Contact Number (Travel brochures, flyers also can be submitted).
- ☐ 7. Bank Statements for the last 6 months
 - * Your passport name must be on it.
- ☐ 8. Tax assessment issued by the CRA showing total income
- ☐ 9. Letter including the reason why a multiple-entry visa is needed.

*If the applicant is a minor, student or does not have sufficient fund themselves, please provide the following:

- Bank accounts of the financial supporter such as a parent or partner
- Official document showing their relationship in English such as a Birth Certificate or a Marriage Certificate
 - If the document is not in English, a notarized translation is needed.
- Photocopy of the Passport ID page of the supporter
